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mcfarland companions to young adult literature american novelist gary paulsen is best known for his young adult fiction including bestsellers nightjohn soldier s heart and woods runner from his trenchant prose in the rifle and the foxman to the witty escapades of harris and me and zero to sixty paulsen crafts stories with impressive range the tender scenes in the quilt and a christmas sonata speak to his empathy for children with characters who endure the same hardships that marred his own early life this literary companion introduces readers to his life and work a to z entries explore themes such as alcoholism coming of age slavery survival and war a glossary defines terms unique to his work appendices provide related historical references writing art and research topics

i love writing i absolutely love it asserts gary paulsen who since 1966 has published more than 100 books among them nonfiction autobiographical works for adults and paperback series and picture books for children still paulsen s widespread critical and popular reputation rests principally on his two dozen plus novels for young adults which include the newbery honor books dogsong 1986 hatchet 1988 and the winter room 1990 presenting gary paulsen the first book length critical biography of this fascinating writer offers readers both an overview of paulsen s life and an analysis of his extensive body of work for young adults drawing amply on a series of personal interviews with paulsen gary m salvner provides readers with a vivid portrait of his subject and a lively assessment of how the writer s life and work come together thematically arranged chapters correlate stories with life experiences and examine the motifs techniques and voices paulsen so winningly employs covered as well are the writer s contributions to adult nonfiction and children s literature a concluding chapter investigates the now and future gary paulsen today s writing and tomorrow s plans

of the many themes occurring in young adult literature one that bears more extensive exploration is the adolescent animal connection although substantial critical commentary has addressed children s animal stories and animals in adult fiction very few studies have been devoted to adolescent animal encounters in animals in young adult fiction walter hogan examines several hundred novels and stories to explore the ways in which animals are represented in these works in addition to providing an historical survey hogan looks at both realistic fiction and speculative works including fantasy supernatural horror and science fiction hogan reviews stories that feature wild animal encounters stories centered on relationships with horses dogs and other working and performing animals and those featuring relationships with pets drawing upon established scholarship this book examines human animal relationships from multiple angles making it an invaluable resource for librarians teachers and students of children s and young adult literature
